# THE HIGH STREET



- Troughs sponsored by local organisations and businesses along the High Street will be filled with winter colour.

# WAR MEMORIAL FLOWER BED REFURBISHMENT

## HORTICULTURE AND GARDENING

- St Joseph's School has been pivotal to Cranleigh in Bloom this year and will be even more so in 2015. They will grow the bedding plants for the troughs & hanging baskets in Cranleigh. More pupils will study for their RHS Level One Certificate – this year all students have obtained outstanding results. The aim will be to offer RHS courses to pupils at other schools.

- We will use the Brownies' logo for Cranleigh in Bloom in 2015.
- Local organisations are interested in getting involved to provide support for Cranleigh in Bloom events in the future, e.g. the Women's Institute and the Lion Tamers.
- Cranleigh cranes – next year we would like to get more people involved in making cranes.
- The enhancement in the environment is hoped to promote community pride and encourage people to take part in litter picks and weeding etc. organised within the community.
- We will work with the Rotary & Lions on future projects.





## ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

- We will support and develop the current four IYNS and encourage more roads to work together – Mead Close has already asked to be involved in 2015 – to build a good community infrastructure.



New plants will be sourced locally and the flower beds maintained by volunteers. Conservation and development projects are planned and Summerlands wildlife corridor will be improved. New building projects are including open spaces and playgrounds for the community to use. A wild flower meadow has been suggested for 2015.





- SUSTAINABILITY

- To encourage people to get involved we will improve publicity, develop a website and explore the use of social media.
- We will continue a successful programme of fundraising.
- The U3A Garden Club have arranged a Plant Sale and hope to have a Garden Tea Party to raise funds for CiB.
- Other fundraising events include the Art and Flower Arranging Exhibition in June 2015.
- St Joseph's will grow plants and will work with other schools to refill hanging baskets already purchased by the businesses.
- In 2015 there will be a greater involvement by the Churches – the Methodist church and St Nicolas' both held Flower Festivals this year as part of CiB.
- We aim to include Snoxhall Park, allotments and other open spaces in the 2015 entry.
