## WAR MEMORIAL FLOWER BED REFURBISHMENT

The tired roses will be replaced by.....

A band of Red Flower Carpet Roses, with fragrant, white Winchester Cathedral Roses at the 4 corners, all edged by Munstead Wood Lavender.





## WAR MEMORIAL FLOWER BED REFURBISHMENT (CONT'D)

And for Winter colour 2 of the outer beds will be planted with dwarf Cornus that has red stems as well as white flowers in the Summer.

## Updates from the Parish Council on:-

- The cleaning of the War Memorial
- A donation of 'working wood' trees from the Woodland Trust.
- Parish Council High Street Flowerbeds

## PROGRESS ON THE HIGH STREET

- The 2,000 bulbs are starting to show their heads along the High Street and will soon burst into flower
- 14 troughs will be installed outside businesses, in Fountain Square and around the Obelisk and the Millenium sculpture
- So far 30 hanging baskets have been ordered
- The Rotary and Chamber have adopted the flower beds near to the War Memorial and the Millennium bed

## PROGRESS ON THE HIGH STREET (CONT'D)

- The U3A Garden Club has adopted the raised beds in Fountain Square and will sow Flanders poppies along the High Street
- We have received very generous donations from the Lions, Rotary, Chamber and other businesses

# NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHEMES



## Summerlands Estate

- Enhance the entrance with a feature including flowers, to be designed and built by residents
- Maintain and develop the pond & wildlife corridor
- Sow Flanders poppies in the estate

# NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHEMES (CONT'D)



## Mead Road

- Beautify the front gardens, help those less able to work on their gardens and plant lavender and Flanders poppies to attract bees and other insects
- Sow Flanders poppies in the grass verges
- Hold a Tea Party for the residents and Judges on Judging Day!

# COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND EVENTS UPDATE



- March • Rotary, Co-op and U3A Garden Club volunteers to plant roses and lavenders in War Memorial beds
- End March • Flanders poppy seeds to be sown in all the flower beds along the High Street, in schools and in residents gardens
- 25 March • Rotary Club Quiz – profit donated to CiB
- St Joseph's hanging baskets at Spring into Cranleigh
- 3 May • Spring into Cranleigh miniature garden competition
- Mid May • Flanders poppies to be planted in War Memorial
- 17 May • Cantilena Flower Concert at St Nicholas Church
- 24 May • Lunch time and evening concerts at St Nicholas Church

## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND EVENTS UPDATE (CONT'D)

- 21 June • Garden Festival at the Arts Centre
- 28 June • Cranleigh Carnival to include Cranleigh in Bloom theme
- July • Judging Day to have flower arrangements by U3A Flower Arranging Group and a Tea Party in Mead Road
